Our Ideal Location:

New Ross is an ideal location for importing and exporting bulk cargo goods to and from Ireland.

Each of the four facilities at New Ross have immediate access to the national primary roads and motorways linking the port to cities and towns around Ireland within a matter of hours.

The surrounding hinterland is very accessible through the national road network. Dublin, Cork and Limerick are a 2-hour drive, with the heart of Ireland's Midlands just 2.5 hours away enhanced by the opening of the Rose Fitzgerald Kennedy Bridge in 2020.

Our Port Facilities:

The Port of New Ross has a wide choice of facilities in four locations on both sides of the River Barrow at New Ross Town. On the Western side of the river is the 215m-long Rosbercon Jetty, which has a weighbridge and can cater for two vessels simultaneously . Also, on the Western side of the river is Raheen Jetty, a dry bulk facility, at 60m long.



Downriver on the Eastern side of the river at Stokestown there is a 60m pontoon berth with weighbridge and nearby warehousing and open storage.

Mobile cranes are available on all berths.

Marshmeadows Jetty which is owned and operated by Wexford County Council can cater for a wide variety of vessel types including liquid bulk. This Jetty has recently undergone extensive upgrade works and is an ideal location for importation / exportation into the Southeast of the Country.

Berth Locations and Specifications

- Three ISPS (International Ship & Port Security) port facilities available •
- One Non-ISPS facility available
- Pilotage Compulsory
 - Max Vessel Dimensions; 110m length / 18m breadth / 6.2m draft (spring \triangleright tides)
 - > Arriving Vessels enter 30 minutes before HW
 - Departing Vessels up to 2 hours before HW \triangleright

- Concrete Jetty •
- Main pier; 60 metres in length. Overall length; including dolphin 90 metres •
- Mooring buoy installed (April 2023) can accommodate vessels up to 110 • metres
- NAABSA Berth
- Capable of handling dry bulk and liquid cargoes •
- Weighbridge on site; NSAI approved 50MT
- Site area approx. 4 Acres

Stokestown Port Facility (ISPS Certified)

- Floating Steel Pontoon 60 metres in length •
- Can accommodate vessels up to 100 metres in length •
- Vessels always afloat
